By taking local mentoring initiatives and connecting them to a nationwide and global movement, MWM proves that change comes from efforts on the ground with an overall shared mission and approach

Currently with a total workforce of 5,600 employees, 50% are females with no salary discrepancies. ZAFA strongly condemns glass ceiling and provide inspiring growth opportunities to female staff. Besides, ZAFA takes great pride in sponsoring and supporting women empowerment initiatives. Recently, ZAFA has sponsored Miss IgraNazir Ahmed- the female Martial Arts International Champion who is the first and only fighter from her game since 1970. ZAFA fulfilled her dream and sent her for the International Kyokushin Karate Tournament in Poland, where she was the only girl from Pakistan and secured 3rd place by beating 67 countries. Moreover, ZAFA has a wide range of products related to improving women health as well as life saving products for mothers. Zafa realises that to become empowered & good entreprenuers, women must first be in good health.

Intended Objectives and Activities

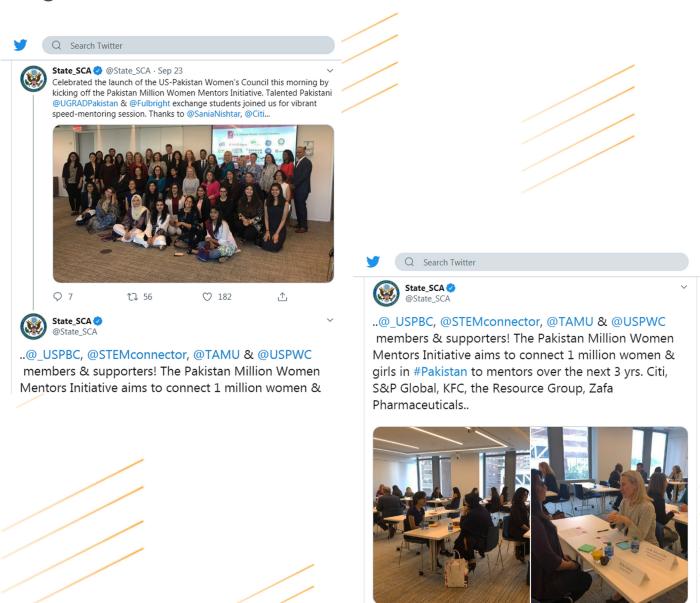
Our aim was to mentor a total of 500 women. For this the mentorship was divide into two parts; one for LHVs, nurses & mid-wives and the other for house wives or other professionals. The program for house wives & other professionals provided training on the subject of maternal & general health, keeping in mind the fact that, with imporved health women are better able to tackle other areas of their lives & put themselves on the road to empowerment.

The LHVs, nurses & mid-wives program included trainings on the use of life saving drugs for mothers & infants.

For our mentorship program we covered the larger sindh area keeping in mind the following additional objectives:

• Target the interior and under-privileged areas of Sindh region to empower women.

- Provide mentorship based on 3 core paradigms of; Education, Employment and Entrepreneurship
- Develop public and private sector outreach to create employment and entrepreneurship opportunities.
- Improve the living standards and overall health of under privileged women.







Maternal Health Mentorship:

Population growth in interior region is one of the most alarming and menacing issues of the economy. Therefore, ZAFA took the initiative of providing awareness on family planning and the usage and benefits of contraceptives along with a very benefiting session on maternal health. We targeted the underprivileged interior regions of Sindh.

Conducting these sessions has facilitated the women in improving their mental and physical health, consequently paving the way for them to become empowered individuals.
